TYPES OF PRONOUNS

PERSONAL

refers to a specific person or thing. They are used as a substitute for a noun or pronoun in a sentence : I, me, her, you, it

INTERROGATIVE

These are used in asking questions : who, what, which, why, whom.

INDEFINITE

These refer to things or people without being specific : all, few, none, several, somebody.

RELATIVE

These connect one phrase or clause to another phrase or clause to add more information : which, whomever, that.

INTENSIVE

These are used to put more emphasis to a subject and end in -self or -selves : himself, themselves, itself.

POSSESSIVE

These are used to show ownership or possession of a noun : my, our, their, her, yours.

REFLEXIVE

These refer back to the subject of the clause or sentence : herself, ourselves, themselves.

DEMONSTRATIVE

These point to something specific in a sentence. These indicate items in space or time, either singular or plural : This, That, Those.

DISTRIBUTIVE

These refer to things or persons one at a time : either, neither, each.

RECIPROCAL

These are used for actions and feelings that are reciprocated : each other, one another
